















































On May 30, 1431, Joan of Arc was burned at the stake. As the flames rise, Joan prays intensely, accepting her fate with faith.

She cried out for Jesus more than six times! and especially in her last breath, she cried out with a loud voice Jesus! so much so that everyone could hear it; almost all of them cried with hit.



In 1455, Pope Callxtus III, at the initiative of Joan's mother, established an ecclesiastical tribunal in Rouen intended to re-examine the conditions of the first trial. On July 7, 1456, hundreds of witnesses, childhood companions and comrades-in-arms of Joan, came to testify before the judges who concluded that Joan was moreout and completely rehabilisted her.

Nearly 500 years after her death, the holiness of Joan of Arc was recognized by the Church.
In 1909, Pope Pius X beatified her. Then, in 1920, Pope Benedict XV canonized her, thus consecrating her holiness.



Since 1920, the National Day of Joan of Arc has been celebrated each year on the second Sunday of May, anniversary of the liberation of Orléans on May 8, 1420 by the French army, under the command of Joan of Arc.
